me into this world, and, at whose command, I shall be numbered
with the dead. - Being now, by the blessing of my Maker, in good
health and my mind serene, at peace with all good men and having
malice or enmity to none - believing firmly in a glorious resurrection
of the just - and that the wicked will be treated according to their
deserts. - I have thought fit to make this my Last Will and
Testaments in consciousness of the uncertainty of life, and the neces-
sity of arrangements to be made for the payment of my debts, and
for the benefit of my family after my death.

Firstly. It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon
as possible, after my decease; and that this important matter may
be properly attended to, with as much benefit to my family as the
case may admit. I do hereby appoint my Son Lewis F. J. B. B. B.
at present of Augusta in this State, and my Friend Whipple
of the County of Camden State of Georgia, my Executors to
carry this my Last Will and Testament into effect.

Secondly. Whichever may remain, after paying my just debts as aforesaid, I desire
that it may be disposed of in the following manner: - viz. To my Son
Sophia Louisa B. B. B. being the youngest and without any other issue
I give and bequeath the same to her.

To my Daughter Mary Gibson one sixth part of George Gibson's estate
 now East Florida, one sixth part
 To my daughter Martha Gibson one sixth part of West & East Florida now
 near Tallahassee Florida one sixth part
 To my son John Douglass Gibson one sixth part
 To my son William John Gibson one twelfth part having expended
 large sums of money for his Education &c.
 To my son Lewis F. P. Gibson at present of Augusta one sixth part and
 the remaining one twentieth I give and bequeath to my Brothers Joseph
 John Thomas and Samuel Gibson, and my sister Sarah who has been
 married to Mr Clark, all of Rugby Warwickshire, England, - this
 remaining one twentieth to be equally divided among them or their heirs
 or legal representatives.

In Witness whereof I have affixed my Hand and Seal
 in the County of Camden, State of Georgia, this twenty sixth day of
 March in the year of our Lord, one Thousand eight hundred and twenty
 eight.
