

I James Zachry of the County of Richmond in the said State, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby certify that the following is my last will and testament in the words following: I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved Wife Mary Zachry all the Tract of land I now live on, containing Two hundred Acres, be the same more or less, lying and being in the said County of Richmond on both sides of the Wheel Creek together with all my personal Estate consisting of two Negroes named James and Sarah, with their future increase, Horses Cows Sheep & Hogs, Farming utensils, and House-Hold goods except one feather bed, which shall be hereafter named, all during the natural life of my said Wife, subjected to the maintenance of my Daughter Betty an Idiot.

I give and bequeath to my son William Zachry, his Heirs and Assigns forever, Two hundred acres of land, lying on the waters of the Wheel Creek which he now lives on being part of a Tract of four hundred Acres.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Dudley her Heirs and Assigns forever, fifty Acres of land, being part of the said Tract containing four hundred Acres, also one hundred Acres of land on savannae land joining lands formerly Saramours and Milton.

I give and bequeath to James Blackstone and John Blackstone, one hundred and fifty Acres of land being the balance of said part of that above

mentioned

Tract of four hundred acres of land
that my son William now lives on, and to their
Heirs and Affixons forever.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Betty, one
feather bed and furniture, and to her Heirs and
Affixons forever. Also should my Dear Daughter
Betty survive the death of my Dear by beloved
~~Wife, then and in that case, the said Tract~~
of land and Negroes, already bequeathed to my
said Wife shall be vested in her during her
natural life

After the Decease of my said Wife and Daughter
Betty, I give and bequeath to William Yarbrough
and James Yarbrough my grand sons and lawfull
sons of Littleton Yarbrough, All that Tract
of land that I now live on and already bequeathed
to my said Wife and Daughter Betty, to be equally
Divided between them, Share and Share alike
and to their Heirs and Affixons forever.

It is my Will and pleasure, that after the Decease
of my said Wife, all the personal Estate then
remaining (except the two Negroes James &
Sarah already bequeathed) to be publickly
Vended, and the Moneys arising therefrom to
be equally Divided among all my Children,
that is to say, John Zachry, Winifred Polackson
James Zachry, Deceased, William Zachry

And lastly; I do Ordain, constitute & appoint

my Dearly beloved Wife ~~Ann~~ ^{Betty} my
sole and entire Executrix, to receive all Debts due
and to pay all Legal Demands against my
