Schley County I, Burton Congleton of
said State and county being in
rather feeble health & knowing that I am liable at any
time to depart from this life deem it right and
proper that I should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind Providence has blessed
me. I therefore make this my last will and
testament hereby revoking and annulling all
others heretofore made by me;

Item 1st It is my desire that my body be buried in a
decent manner suitable to my circumstances &
condition; My soul I trust will return to God
who gave it;

Item 2nd It is my desire that my debts be paid as
soon as they become due as there is no necessity
for delay;

Item 3rd After all of my debts have been paid then
it is my will Schley County Georgia One Hundred dollars to be
taken from 1858-1865 the Capital of money & notes to
www.georgiapioneers.com be devoted to a monument over my grave
provided I should die where I should be convenient
for my executors to reach me without doing
injustice to themselves; If the monument
should not be erected, then the Four Hundred
dollars will be equally divided among those
mentioned in the following items;

Item 4th The balance of my estate of every description
to be sold or otherwise disposed of and be equally
divided between my brother Austin Congleton &
my two sisters to wit; Lemmiza Congleton &
Sarah L. Howard;

Item 5th My other sister Arrey Springer; I will
no part of my estate whatever;

Item 6th There is some money that is due me through
the right of my mother; Sarah Congleton from
the estate of James Cherry; and also from
the estate of James Liddy; the amount
due me in each of these estates. I will to those
mentioned in the fourth item and
equally divided.

Item 7th I appoint my worthy and trusty friends,
Austin Congleton and John Neobard
executors to this my last will & testament;
November 6th 1858
