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2 Item. I desire and direct that all my just debts
 be paid without delay.

3 Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
 Charlott, with whom I have lived in strictest quiet for
 fifty three years, all my property. (for and during her
 natural life only). My negro woman named Candi
 my plantation tools household and kitchen furniture, my
 Warr, my Cattle and hogs, and all else of my property
 whatever it may be. I give to wife during her natural life.

4 Item. After the death of my wife, I give and bequeath
 all my property, which she may not use for her support
 during her (my wife) natural lifetime. between my son
 James N. Harris, and my daughter Eliza Stewart
 forever.
