April Term 1862

Schley County

In the name of God Amen,

I John Sigler of said Schley County, being of a rancid age but of sound & disposing mind & memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do hereby declare & express with a full respect my family & myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do hereby make this my last will & testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made

I desire & direct that my body be buried in a Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances in life, my soul I trust shall return to that rest God will give to us I hope for salvation through the merits & atonement of the blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors in the names, & appointed,

I give and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Sigler for & during her natural life only a widowhood my land situate on the one hand & seven ten hundredths of her hundred & one half acres & fifty acres more or less off of lot number one hundred & twenty five land situate being & lying in the same hundred & forty sixth district (1746) of said County also in the same way I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Caroline all of my other property that I now have or may have at my death, consisting of horses, cattle & sheep and all of my farming utensils and household & kitchen furniture, all the above named property property I mean that my beloved wife shall keep & use for the benefit of herself my children during her natural life and, at her death for all of said property to be sold, and, equally distributed, to each one of my children,

I hereby do make & appoint my friend Mark A. Perry executor of this my last will & testament, this 14th March 1862,

pleased a kind Providence to make me steward, over
I dispose of in the following manner,

Item 1. I desire all my real estate, paid

Item 2. Thomas I have given by deed to the wife of
Holloway Levene a negro woman Ann, and to the
wife of Thomas Levene a negro woman Abby, and
as I desire to put all my children upon an equality
I therefore give grant and devise to Matthew W. Myrick
a negro woman named Elisha, I give grant & devise
to Martha Francis Myrick a girl named Lena, I give
grant & devise to Septimus W. Myrick Jr a negro girl
named Louella, I give grant & devise to Nathaniel W.
Myrick a negro girl named Edie. I give grant &
devise to Mary Jane Myrick a negro girl named
Harriet, I give grant & devise to Mr. Thomas Myrick
a negro girl named Emily.

Item 3. I give grant & devise to my wife Catherine Myrick
the lot of land in which I now live, a negro man
named Augustus & his wife Frances then three children
Lula, Lavinia & Harrietta, and Dury, also two mules
known as Mary & Rhody, also two cows & cats, also three
pigs, also fifteen chickens, also two best horses
Hiram & together with as much of the kitchen
furniture as may be necessary for her use, after as
