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Item 2nd I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executor herein after named
as I am unwilling that my Executors should be
delayed of their rights, especially as there is no
necessity for delay.

Item 3rd The rest of my property both Real & Personal,
wherever & whatever it may be, I devise and bequeath
to my beloved Brother, John G. Worsham, to him &
his heirs forever.

Item 4th I constitute & appoint my brother John G. Worsham
aforesaid, Executor of this my last Will and Testa-
ment this December 11th 1860.
