disposition of the property, with which a kind
Providence has blessed me, do hereby make
the following as my last Will and Testament,

Article 1st I will bequeath and devise unto my son
in-Law James W. Woodall all that tract of
Land known as the East half of Lot of Land
to one hundred and forty three (143) in
the fourth district of originally Muscogee now
Marion County, to have and to hold the same
unto him self and his heirs forever,

Article 2nd I will and bequeath unto my son-in-Law
James W. Woodall, the following negroes, to wit,
Lucy, a woman, a bout six, three years of age,
Albert, a man, ^{Schley County Wills} ¹⁸⁵⁸⁻¹⁸⁶⁵ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} three years of age,
And Ellen, a woman about twenty years of
age, to have and to hold the same to himself
and his heirs forever,

Article 3rd I will and bequeath unto my son-in-Law
James W. Woodall my horses, cows, hogs and
stock of all kinds and any and all other
property, which I may have and possess at the
time of my death, to have and to hold the
same unto him self and his heirs forever,

Article 4th I do here by constitute and appoint my friend
Thaddeus Oliver, as my Executor to this my
last Will & Testament, to see the same faith-
fully executed and performed,
