I wish Strickley attended to

Fourth I bequeath that when my eldest child shall  
arrive at the age of maturity all property shall be  
equally divided between my Children my Land Excepted  
which I wish to continue undivided until the youngest  
child shall arrive at the age of maturity then also to be  
equally divided between my children as aforesaid

Fifth I Will and bequeath that after my eldest child's
