give and devise after the decease of my dear Delia to

Syloria, one Girl named Sarah one Girl Claryea and  
boy named Isaac together with all their issue also the  
land & forty nine acres of land original survey in the Co  
of Scriven being in three several surveys & purchased from  
Blair & one which I now reside together with all my house  
goods & stock of every kind of which I may be possessed

At my desire Beavill & his wife did make their last Will and Testament at my desire that they be performed at my death, to have & his last Will & Testament of the said Paul Beavill above mentioned because without lawful issue my will is that all the above mentioned property & all both Real & personal of which may be possessed of at my decease shall be equally divided between my Brother Tayl Board - Two nephews Paul Beavill & James Beavill sons of my Brother Paul Beavill Esq<sup>r</sup>. To them & their Heirs for ever Reserving as before mentioned to my dear wife Maria all & every part & power Real & personal of the above mentioned property as well as to any other both Real & personal all property of which I may own at my Deceas during her自然 life but & so much as I before mentioned unto my adopted son Paul Beavill Garnett (deceased) & his heirs for ever but should the said Paul Beavill Garnett die without heirs without heir or lawful issue then as is before mentioned unto my two nephews Tayl Beavill & Paul Beavill sons of my brother Paul Beavill Esq<sup>r</sup> & their Heirs for ever
