make this my last will and testament hereby re-
voking all other heretofore made by me
I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid as soon after my decease as possible
and I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Marion for and during her natural life
my estate both real and personal and her decease
be equally divided between them share and share
alike
Item 2nd I hereby appoint my beloved wife executrix
in my last will and testament and Guardian of
my children. I also give to my beloved wife sole
power and authority to use and control the property
bequeathed to her as she in her discretion may
fit for the maintenance of herself and children
buy and sell with full authority to make and receive
warranties of the same and whenever it may appear
her to be necessary to either or any of
children such portions of the estate as can be spared
in the same but each gift shall be charged to each
child or children as so much of their part of my estate
be accounted for free of interest at the final distribution
my estate. In a word it is my intention and desire
at my wife shall use the property bequeathed to her
the purposes above named with the same authority
and control over it as I myself had during my life
