ordain this my last will & testament in the manner following
to wit first I recommend my soul to god and into the hands and
protecting clemency of the Almighty God who gave it and my body
to the dust from whence it came to be buried in decent chro-
nican burial at the discretion of my executors here after named
Second And as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased
god to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of
and bequeath the same as follows & imprecisely give and
bequeath unto my beloved son Isaac Congers Two Hundred
dollars to him and his heirs forever item I give and bequeath
unto my beloved son Daniel Congers Two Hundred Dollars to
him his heirs forever item I give and bequeath unto my
beloved daughter Elizabeth Congers At this Two Hundred
dollars to her and her heirs forever item I give and bequeath
unto my grand daughter Elizabeth Congers Two Hundred Dollars to
her and her heirs forever item I give and bequeath unto
my grandsons John and James Stearns
of a Negro girl Slave named Betsy and her issue and income
to them their heirs forever item I give and bequeath unto
my beloved daughter Polly Congers her heirs forever.
The following named property to wit Sally aged forty years
Peggy aged thirty years Frank aged fifty years Sarah aged
thirteen years Phillip aged six years Mary aged four years
Clydia aged three years and Jane aged just as five months
with their further issue and income together with all other
Property of which I may die Possessed or intitled
unto to be at his own disposal corporately individual or otherwise
disposal — This legacy to said daughter Polly Congers
is subject however to the payment of all the before mentioned
pecuniary legacies and my said Daughter is charged with the
payment of the same and a sufficient portion of my estate
that as the may think proper is to be sold to pay said
legacies if she cannot otherwise raise the money to pay
the same and my said Daughter Polly Congers is
further charged with the payment of my funeral
expenses and just debts due by me of any at my decease

the nature it may consist of is what shall be known to
said Polly C. Longers and her heirs forever from further
condition or restriction whatsoever. Lastly I do hereby Revoke
all and every other power and other will and testament by me
at any time or in any manner heretofore made allowing
Revising and amending this and no other to be my last will
and testament and do hereby make over constitute and appoint
my said daughter Polly C. Longers to be sole executrix of this
my last will and testament in testifying whom of those here-
unto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of July in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five
and in the sixtieth year of the independence of the United States
of America signed and sealed and published in presence of
of Rachel Goodall & H B the said Polly C. Longers
Seaborn Goodall 3 is to be allowed full fees to pay
all the above mentioned pecuniary
legacies the wife and children and
no more for ever signed

Court for the County aforesaid personally
appeared Seaborn Goodall who being duly sworn deposed
and sayeth that he said the witness named John Longers
sign and execute the within instrument as his last will
and testament that said testator was of sound and disposing
mind at the time of executing the same and that Rachel
Goodall together with respondent signed their names thereto
as witnesses in his presence and in the presence of each
other aboveunto and subscribed before us this 27th April
1836 John C. Rivers 2862 Seaborn Goodall
J B Hunter 2263

I do here by swear that this writing contains the true and
last will of the witness named John Longers Deceased so far
as I know or believe and that is will and truly executed the same
by paying first the debts and then the legacies contained in
the said will as far as his goods and chattels will then be
extant and the law permits and that I will make a true
and just inventory of all such goods and chattels
to help my god Form Stafford L 53
