

In the of God Amen, I Joseph Coughron of the State of Georgia, County of Brewster, being weak of body, but of sound mind and understanding, calling to mind that it is ordained for all men once to die, Do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in manner and form following: revoking all other former Wills, by me made, first I recommend my soul into the hands of God, that gave it; secondly it is my Will & Desire that my body may be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named; Thirdly it is my desire that my Just debts be paid; Fourthly, and as touching my worldly goods, Items, I give & bequeath unto my son Matthew Coughron & to his heirs & Assigns for ever, three hundred acres of Land, two hundred known by the Old field Tract, and One hundred acres out of a three hundred acre Tract adjoining the old field Tract; Item I give & bequeath unto my son Charles Coughron, & to his heirs & Assigns for ever, three hundred and twenty acres of Land, two hundred & twenty acres known by the Pond Tract, and the One hundred acres adjoining the Pond Tract, out of a three hundred acre Tract; Item, I give & bequeath unto my daughter Hannah Coughron & to her heirs and Assigns for ever Two hundred and fifty acres of Land known by the Hodges Tract; Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand son, John Coughron & to his heirs & Assigns for ever, son of my daughter Isbel Hannah, One hundred and fifty acres of Land adjoining of Samuel Newton; Item I give & bequeath unto my grand son ^{Scriven Co. Ga. Will Book 2-B (1808-1879)} ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} ~~and~~ to his heirs and Assigns for ever son of my daughter Mary Dyer Two hundred & two and a half acres lying in Wilfair County, in the Sixth District known by lot N. 284; Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Children William Usher, Thomas Usher, Marthow Usher, & Isbel Usher and to their heirs & Assigns for ever, Children of my daughter Sarah Usher, One hundred acres of Land whereon they now live the same being a part of a three hundred acre tract; & Abel Usher the husband of my daughter Sarah Usher is not to interfere with the said Land in any respect; Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Children Margaret Coughron, Catharine Coughron, James M. Coughron & to their heirs & Assigns for ever Children of my son Robert Coughron One hundred & fifty Acres of Land whereon they now live; Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Wife Marthow all the residue of my property & she is to & enjoy the place wherein she now lives & the place known by the pond Land, which I have given unto my son James, & she is to live with him, and all the personal property is to be equally divided among his own Children that is to say Robert Coughron, Mary Evers, Isbel Hannah, Sarah Usher, Matthew Coughron, Hannah Coughron & James Coughron at her death. Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my friends Mund Croft and James Archer my Executors to this my last Will & Testament; In Witness whereof I have hereunto set and affixed my hand and

 they saw Wm Donaldson & Hugh Donaldson subscribe their names as wit-
 nesses with themselves to the same. — So help us God. —

 and this my last Will & Testament, that is to say principally
 first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
 God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in
 decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting
 but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
 power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it is
 pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise & dispose of the same in
 the following manner & form. First I give and bequeath to Ellender my
 dearly beloved wife all my lands & Household & Kitchen furniture, also all
 my working tools and my stock of Horses, cattle & Hogs, also all my Negroes
 to keep and dispose of as may be most desirable for the raising, edu-
 cating and benefit of my children enduring her widowhood or till my son
 Eli comes to the years of sixteen if he should live, then the whole of the
 property whatever is then to be equally divided, with an exception of such
 property as my Wife shall make choice of for a comfortable support her
 time, it be an equal share, with the other heirs, and likewise I constitute
 ordain, my beloved Wife, Ellender Meigs Executrix and my trusty friend
 James Tender Executor with her of this my last will & Testament to ac-
 cept and singular my real and personal estate by them freely to be possessed
 and to dispose of according to tenor of said Will and I do hereby
