Fourthly: I give bequeath can devise to my Daughter
Eliza F. Rushing wife of William Rushing for her
sole and separate use for and during her natural
life free and exempt from the debts and liabilities
of her present or a future husband: all that tract or
parcel of Land upon which the said William Rushing
now resides containing three hundred acres more
or less with all the rights members and appurtenan-
ces to the same belonging or in any wise appertain-
ing there to for and on her decease to such child or children
as she may leave.

Fifthly: I give bequeath can devise to my Daughter
Mary C. Rushing wife of Washington C. Rushing for
her sole and separate use for and during her natural
life free and exempt from the debts and liabilities
of her present or a future husband all that parcel
or tract of Land containing three hundred acres
more or less adjoining lands bequeathed to A. J. & W. H.
Hunt John Bullen Thomas C. & S. White's Land with
all the rights members and appurtenances to the same
belonging or in any wise appertaining there to
for and on her decease to such child or children as
she may leave.

Seventhly: I give bequeath can devise to my Daughter
Sarah R. & Graham wife of Thomas C. Graham for
her sole and separate use for and during her natural
life free and exempt from the debts and liabilities
of her present or a future husband the Western Half
of that body of Land upon which the said Graham

Sixthly: I give bequeath can devise to my Daughter
Ann Watson wife of William Watson for her sole
and separate use for and during her natural life free
from the debts and liabilities of her present or a fu-
ture husband the Eastern Half of that body or tract
of Land upon which the said Watson and A. E. Graham
now reside the dividing line to run from the north
corner to the Southern line; also all that parcel or tract
of Land adjoining Thomas W. & C. S. White's Land
containing two hundred acres more or less with
all the rights members and appurtenances to the said
two tracts belonging or in any wise appertaining
there to for and on her decease to such child or children
as she may leave.

Seventhly: I give bequeath can devise to my daughter
Sarah R. & Graham wife of Thomas C. Graham for
her sole and separate use for and during her natural
life free and exempt from the debts and liabilities
of her present or a future husband the Western Half
of that body of Land upon which the said Graham

307. I give to my said wife Mary Ann all the adjoining tracts of land on which I now live to hold the same for her own use and benefit during her widowhood; and in case she marries then the same shall become the property of any child or children she may have in fee simple:-

4th I wish and declare the same as my Will that all my stock of cattle Hogs Sheep Horses mules be sold at such time and place as my executor may deem best for the interest of my Heirs except the following mules and Horses: 1 old mule Sandy; 1 Gray Horse and one Sorrel Horse:-

5th I wish and declare the same as my last Will that my wagon Timber Carriage Carts and Sugar Cider be sold at such time as my Executor may deem best; The proceeds arising from the sale of the things enumerated in the 4th & 5th clauses of this will be divided equally between my three children and wife when equal share alike:-

6th The cattle belonging to my children I desire my Executors to sell at such time as to them may seem proper and the money arising from the sale of each child's stock to be kept separate for the use of each child:-

7th I give and bequeath unto my son Granford Lovett all that tract or parcel of Land on the waters of Little Ogeechee adjoining Lands of Theophilist Holwell and Thomas T. Lovett and other lands of John T. Lovett containing four Hundred Acres Originally granted to E. C. Lester and decendants and also a portion of a Lot adjoining the same granted to said John T. Lovett for Eight Hundred Acres said portion to be two Hundred Acres lying on one side and adjoining said four Hundred and together with the four Hundred above mentioned making in all Six Hundred Acres all in Warren County and State of Georgia and I further direct my Executors to hold the same until my son Granford arrives at the age of twenty three at which time it shall be given up to him in fee simple:-

8th I give and bequeath all the balance of my lands situate in the County and State of Georgia

Crop on the crop on Hand at my death and
will before; To Have and To Hold the said Stock
of Horses, Cattle and Hogs, Plantation and Tobacco
with Tools and the grain and gathered crop
at my death from and after my death equally
and as shears alike unto the said Mary Ann, Mar-
ry and Francis Daughtery; Their Executors adminis-
trators and assigns, to them and their only proper
use and benefit behoof forever; And I the said
Joseph Daughtery for myself my heirs executors
and administrators the said bargained premises
unto the said Mary Ann, Mary and Francis
Daughtery and to their heirs Executors adminis-
trators and assigns from and against all persons
shall and will in law and equity defend;
