In the name of God Amen;

I Parcas, Abert being here in health but of sight and disposing mind (and having in view the certainty of all Mortality) I do hereby, make and constitute this my last Will and Testament;

First: of all I resign my Soul to God who gave it and my Body to the same;

2nd I desire that all Debt does be satisfied and paid;

3rd I Give and bequeath unto my Brother John W. Best all my Stock of cattle;

4th All the Rest of my Estate both Real and personal of whatever quality or character I hereby give and Bequeath unto my dear sister Hannah Lee;

And I hereby constitute and appoint John W. Best my Sole Executor
