bound by of Heaven the maker thereof that this my
last will & Testament, hereby recording, can
make & leave all former wills by me at any
time made, revoked.

First I direct that all my just debts to be paid
as soon after my decease, as possible, also I direct
that a fair valuation or appraisement be
made by three, judicious, weighty, who shall
be selected by my Executors, within eight to be
named, of all my estate both real & personal
and after being signed with their names, that
a copy of the same shall be given by them to
my Executors, I give for bequeath to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Hillman, for as long as her natural
life, all my Estate, both real & personal, pro-
vided she remains, a widow, but in case of her
marriage it is my will & desire, that a suffi-
cient portion of my Estate, be appropriated to the
support of my two young Children, Elizabeth
& Nathan, to be paid to them as I wish
this portion to be appropriated, for said purposes
in case my said wife should die before my said
youngest Child should come of age, the
balance of my Estate real & personal, in the
event of the marriage of my wife, I desire and
will to be divided equally between, my wife
and Children, Shear & Shear alike, I hereby
constitute and appoint my beloved wife & then
both Executors of this my last will & Testa-
ment, with full power and authority to con-
vey and manage, my Estate, in the same man-
ner as to the same extent, that I could do if I
were alive, both as regards selling or buying
or making or receiving, either for any proper
purpose, sold or, I further, authorize my
wife to use her own discretion in making such
gifts as she may deem necessary to any of my
Children, but such gifts must be accounted
to them as a part of their portion of my
Estate, whenever a final distribution of the
