to be my last Will and Testament in the manner
following to wit: First it is my desire that
all my just debts be paid;
Secondly, I give and bequeath to Sarah E. B.
Humphreys daughter of Curtis Humphreys,
Fifty Dollars of an amount due me by the
said Curtis Humphreys;
Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto John E. Hum-
phreys son of Curtis Humphreys, Fifty Dollars
of the amount due me by Curtis Humphreys;
Fourthly, I give and bequeath to Curtis Hum-
phreys my stock of Cattle in Georgia;
Fifthly, I give and bequeath unto Martin
L. Bryan the amount of money he owes
me

And Sixthly, I give and bequeath all the
Residue of my Estate both Real and personal
unto my nephew Joseph W. Humphreys;

And lastly I hereby make Constitue and appoi-
nt John M. Allen of South Carolina to be
Curtis Humphreys of Georgia; Executors of this
my last will. My purpose in appointing
an Executor in South Carolina is to collect
and settle my affairs in said State preparatory
to their delivery to my Executor in Georgia
to which State it is my desire all my effects
shall be removed and kept for the benefit
of the legates above named;
