First - It is my Will and desire that all my just debts
be paid and discharged by my Executors hereafter
named and as to the worldly goods that it
has pleased God to bless me with I will and
dispose of in the manner and form following
to wit:

Secondly - I give and bequeath to David Freeman
one Hundred Dollars to be paid to him by my

Executors twelve months after my death.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my Niece Jerry Charlton
" one negro man named Joe one woman named
" Sally one boy named Click one boy named Jacob
" one boy named Robert one woman named Sall
" and her three children Bayler Caroline and Henry
" - after all of which negroes I give to her and the
" heirs borne of her body, and if she die without a
" child the said negroes must return back to
" my nearest Relations.

Fourthly, I give to my Sister Lucy Charlton one Boy
" Horse and gig and one bed and furniture.

Fifthly, I have one tract or parcel of Land drawn by
" Thomas Andros in the County of Monroe
" now Site also one gravel mare and one cream
" coloured Horse which Land and Horses I leave to
" be sold next fall.

Sixthly, I give to my niece Jerry Charlton one good
" Horse and gig and furniture to her and her heirs
" for ever.

Seventhly, Also this plantation and all the Cattle and
" Hogs and all the House Hold and Kitchen fur-
" niture and all the plantation tools and all
" the Notes and all the goods belonging to me
" that is, not otherwise disposed of all of which
" property I leave for the Support of my Niece
" Jerry Charlton during her natural Life
" and also to Support my niece Jerry Charlton
" and also that Samuel Charlton is not to have
" any control nor claim nor benefit of said
" property and it is also my wish for all the
" negroes to be kept together and not to be
" let out. I mean the negroes that I have given
" to my niece Jerry Charlton and if she mar-
" ries the Executors can give her up what they
" think best till my Sister's death and then
" all to be given to my niece Jerry Charlton

" I wish the negroes and every thing to be kept
" together on the plantation and if the Ex-
" ecutors find that there is not profit
" enough arising from the farm the

Sell the plantation and buy another I. wish
 the Executors to manage as they think best.
 It is also my desire that all my notes & accoun-
 ts be opened and appraised by disinterested
 men and a true return made of the same to
 court.

I do hereby appoint my friends George Pollock
 and Henry West my Executors to this my Last
 Will and Testament. Revoking all former Wills
 heretofore by me declaring this to be my Last
 Will and Testament in the presence of these
 Witnesses 22nd March A.D. 1838.
