(3d) It is my wish and my Executor herein after named are hereby instructed after paying the above I do hereby divide Equally by that the Remainder of

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my property. Between my Daughter Sarah I. Long of
Barth's County and State aforesaid for her children and
my Daughter Mary, W. Long Shear and Their Equally
and further it is my will and desire that the whole
of the property both Real and personal that I may
die possessed of after paying the above Legacies shall
in case my Daughter Mary shall die without child
and the whole shall vest in fee simple in child
or children of my Daughter Sarah I. or their children
then in life;

I hereby constitute and appoint my Son in Law
William Cox of the County of Barth and State aforesaid
Executor of this my Last will and Testament;

forty six.
