S. John F. Sonett of Screven County,

State of Georgia being sound of mind and in good health but duly impressed with the uncertainty of life and the necessity of being at all times prepared for death and anxious to have my temporary affairs so arranged as they may not at such a crisis interfere with other thoughts likely to engage my mind: Do publish this my last Will and Testament that is to say:-

1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Ann during her widowhood the following negro slaves to wit: Finch a negro woman about forty five years of age; Eablin a boy about fifteen years of age; Ann a girl about fourteen years of age; with their future increase and at the death or intermarriage of my said wife: it is my Will that they be equally divided between my Daughter Virginia my son Crawford and Daughter Annabella: Water

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2nd I give and bequeath the balance of my negro slaves with their future increase to Anthony B. Sonett and John R. Kittles in Trust. To have and to hold the same for the use and benefit of my three children until such period as either daughter may marry or my son arrive at the age of twenty one when said property shall be equally divided between them; in case of the death of my son without lawful issue then the whole to go to Anthony B. Sonett and John R. Kittles in Trust for my two Daughters during the term of their natural lives and at their deaths to their issue in fee simple and in case of the death of either Daughter before said period without lawful issue then said property I Will to be divided between my son and surviving daughter and such portion as may fall to the lot of my surviving Daughter I Will to Anthony B. Sonett and John R. Kittles to have and to hold the said share for the use and benefit of said surviving Daughter during the term of her natural life and at the

to my children to be sold or sold by me, I
they may seem best for the interest of my children,
9th I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Ann all
my household and kitchen furniture, except a bed
mattress and blanket to each child my gun Rifle and
watch I give to my son Crawford the Rifle and
ch to be sold or kept as my executors may deem
best for the interest of my son: my Wagg, I give
to my wife Mary Ann; the mules and horses, ex-
cepted from sale in the 4th clause of this my
last Will and Testament. I desire my Executors to sell
after the next year and to divide the proceeds
between my wife Mary Ann and my three children.

10th I further will that the following negroes shall
to wit: Sub. March Dinah Eliza Rosanna and
Mary remain upon the place the ensuing year
and that the provisions now upon the place
remain there for the use of the family and stock
the crop that is made upon the place the en-
suing year. I Will my executors to sell the
proceeds arising from the sale to be equally
divided between my wife and three children.
