same in the manner following;

one silver Dollar to him his Heir and assigns forever
Item; Secondly; I give devise and bequeath unto my Daughter Francis
Anderson, one Silver Dollar, to her and her heirs and assigns forever
Item; Thirdly; I give devise and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth
Hudson one Silver Dollar to her and her heirs and assigns forever
Item; fourthly I give devise and bequeath unto my Son in Law Richard
Scragg wiggin one Silver Dollar to him and his heirs and assigns forever
Item; fifthly; I give devise and bequeath unto Louisa Hudson and the
Child or Children that my Daughter Elizabeth Hudson is now Pregnant
with One Negroe Girl named Bess and her future increase to them and
their heirs and assigns forever

Item. Sixtly; I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand Son Richard
Wiggin one Negroe Girl ^{www.georgiajanet.org} to him and his heirs and assigns
forever, but should the said Richard Wiggin die without a prospect then
it is my desire that the said Negroe Girl named Hayw and her increase
should be equally divided between my four children; To wit; my son
Mathew, Robert, and William, and George Banday; to them and
their Executors Administrators and Assigns forever

Item; Seventy; I give devise and bequeath unto my four children M^r
and my Article of my said Estate of all and every kind or nature
whatsoever; and I do hereby nominate and appoint my Friend Paul
Reedle Jr^t, and my son Mathew Banday to be my Executors to they
my last will and Testament, Dated this Sixth day of November in the
year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred & Eleven
