the certainty of death do make and publish this my last
will and Testament; Herein disposing of all my tem-
poral affairs;

First, I request that after my spirit shall have
departed my body shall have a decent and Christian
like burial;

Second, That my debts be paid without unnecessary delay

Third, I give devise and bequeath unto Mulford, Marsh
of the City of Savannah in Trust, as hereinafter
Recited all my Lands, wherever situated of which
the following are a part to wit, lot number four
square Second district Habersham County, containing
two hundred and fifty, 250, acres, lot number one
hundred and eighty six, 186, twenty seventh dist-
ict Early County, lot purchased by my late husband
William at a Sheriff's sale under an Execution, a-
gainst Francis D. Dixon containing one hundred
and nineteen, 19, a quarter acre, situated in
Greenville County

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Lot of Land in Greenville County which was pur-
chased from James Dixon containing one hundred
and seventy five, 175, acres as known as the James
Dixon tract, lot purchased from Daniel Ham-
phreys, situated in Greenville County Ga. contain-
ing two hundred and twenty five, 225, acres;
on the plantation on which I live together with
the improvements on each and every of these Lots
or tracts for plantation use, all my estate
consisting of cattle, sheep, hogs, and flocks of every
kind as and the following named negroes to wit:
Eliza eighteen years old, Olivia forty years old;
a daughter child of the same name, Silvia, six
teen years old, Manuel sixteen years old, Matt
twelve years old, Theresa thirty five years old, and
two children; Henry and Serena, Henry thirty six
years old, Sally an old woman, Theresa eight
years old, Clarissa five years old that is to say
to hold in trust for my niece Abigail, the
daughter of my sister Elizabeth Nelson and
son Heinrich, if she the said Abigail should
die without issue living at her death then

in default of such issue to my wife Elizabeth Wilson the mother of said Abigail for life
remains in fee simple to my nephews Augustus
Francis Sheldon and Michael Daugherty the sons of
my brother James Daugherty when an orator, etc.
Fourth, I give and bequeath to my said nephews the fol-
lowing negroes to wit, to Augustus my Boy Barren
thirteen (13) years old, to Francis my woman, Har-
rington thirty years old, to Sheldon my girl Cherry
seven (7) years old. To Michael my boy Levy eight (8)
years old for them and their heirs forever;
Fifth, To my remaining Brothers and Sisters, I bequeath
my Michael Daugherty, Mary, Eliza and Sarah
and the sum of my brother John and the the part
of my brother William, I leave the sum of five
hundred dollars with the intent that they receive
nothing more from my estate;

Sixth, I give and bequeath my goods effects, and pro-
perty of any kind whatsoever, and all of them
and parts thereof devised or bequeathed to me
before March in and for the trusts set forth
and recited in the foregoing article of this my
last Will and Testament, and I hereby appoint
the said Alfred Alfred as Executor of this my
last Will and Testament;
Seventh, I have published this second day of
August at my plantation in Swinburn County
in the year of our Lord, one thousand
eight hundred and fifty one;

should be delayed in their rights; as there is no
necessity for delay.

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3) I have I give for begeth unto my wife Sarah
law, namely; Sarah the wife of Joshua Spencer;
Sarah the wife of William J. Woods; Mary, the wife
of Henry Brown; Jane, the wife of Ben
Caldwell; Rebecca the wife of John King; Jane
Tracy of Land in Serena County, containing in
both tracts nine hundred and seventy nine acres
more or less one tract containing of seven hundred
and fifty acres and one other tract containing two
hundred and twenty nine acres, the first, namely
tract granted to Jesse Grant and adjoining land
of time of Granting of Baxter at mouth, South
Point of Little as called William Robert & others;
the last mentioned tract adjoining land of the
time of Granting of William J. Robert Grant;
