I do hereby Confirm unto my Son James C. Morton the following property heretofore given to him to wit;

Four negroes named respectively; Henry, Eliza (and Patience); Also Five hundred Dollars in cash; one horse worth one hundred dollars; and one gold watch and chain worth one hundred dollars; And I do further bequeath to him Five hundred dollars in cash.

I do hereby Confirm unto my Son Simeon Morton the following property heretofore given to him to wit;

Three negroes named respectively; Isaac, Mary, and Marge; Also Six hundred dollars in cash; one horse worth one hundred dollars; and one gold watch and chain worth one hundred dollars; And I do further bequeath to him one thousand acres of Land to be conveyed off from the tract upon which he now lives;

I do hereby Confirm unto my Daughter Anne; also the following property heretofore given to her to wit; one negro named Louise; Eight hundred dollars in cash; and one watch and chain worth one hundred dollars; And I do further bequeath to her the following named negroes to wit; Harriet Prince (Sammy); also one horse worth one hundred

dollars or the like amount in cash as she may choose; also Two Hundred dollars in cash I do hereby bequeath unto my Daughters, Victoria, & Norton the following named property; Washburn given to her to wit: one piano worth Two hundred and seventy five dollars; and one gold watch and chain worth one hundred dollars and I do further bequeath to her the following named negroes to wit; Rose, Raymond, Seilla, & Joe. Also seven hundred and twenty five dollars in cash and one horse worth one hundred dollars or the like sum in cash as she may choose;

I do hereby bequeath to my Daughter: Leila or Norton, the following named property to wit; Four negroes named, respectively, Betty, Clara, William and Phil. Also one thousand dollars in cash a gold watch and chain worth one hundred dollars to be bought for her. And one horse worth one hundred dollars; or the like amount in cash as she may choose;

And I do hereby direct and desire my Executor, hereinafter to be named, to replace, with any other negroes which she shall think most proper, my negroes or negroes here bequeathed to my Daughters Victoria and Leila, who may die before my said Daughters, shall become of age; And I further direct and desire that the expenses incurred in executing, properly and liberally my said two daughters Victoria and Leila shall be repaid out of the income of the balance of my Estate; remaining after the distribution hereinbefore directed; and shall not be charged to them in any way; nor deducted from the shares hereinbefore or hereinafter to be appointed to them;

I do hereby bequeath to my beloved wife, Salina Norton the following property, to wit; Four negroes named respectively; Jack, Joney, Hannah and Pompey and also Jumps; Child, and woman Also my horse Mike and the Carriage and harness and one thousand dollars in cash to be hers

during her life and afterwards to revert to my children.
I do hereby direct and desire that the balance of
property of all kind, remaining after the payment
of my just debts and the distribution of my
personal funds money and notes hereinbefore
mentioned shall be held and managed by my wife
as long as she lives and continues a
widow taking all the income of the said estate and
appropriating whatever portion of it may be in
her judgement for her own support and
maintenance and for the maintenance and
education of my two daughters above mentioned to
Victoria and Viola during their minority
appropriating and converting the surplus
benefit and improvement of the property
do further direct and desire that no further
distribution or payments of any kind, other
than those hereinbefore mentioned, shall
be made or allowed out of the estate while
she lives and continues to be a widow; and
when that shall cease the said estate shall be
equally divided among all my children
my wife taking with them a child's part
share and that part to revert to the children
when she dies; all I bearing alike; And
this should occur before my daughters are
married, Victoria and Viola in either of
which shall become of age, they shall each
their share equally with their brothers
sisters; And they shall each select a guardian
who shall take care of them and their property
during their minority or until they are
married;

Finally, I do hereby appoint my wife as
and sole executrix of this my last Will and
entire with full power to carry out its provisions
and the directions and desires herein expressed
she lives and continues a widow; and with
power to appoint by deed or will some person
persons, not interested in this will to
and carry into effect the final distribution
of property hereinbefore directed; when I
shall come for the said distribution

I have had to write this hurriedly
 day of home in the year of our
 first birthday. I am not con-
 fidently sure of the facts in
 our personal and religious expe-
 riences in the presence of the
 children of our work.
