memory & calling to mind the mortality of body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & Testament
And principally & first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it, & my body to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial:
And touching such worldly goods & chattels, wherewith it has been please God
to bless me in this world I give demise & dispose of in the following manner and
form. Item 1st I give & bequeath to my beloved Brother Richard M. Williamson
the following Negro Slave, to wit, ^{or} a lad of about eighteen or twenty years
of age & Edward a boy of about sixteen years to him the said Richard M.
Williamson & the heirs of his body; Also one vessel Horse named Rambler?
Item 2^d I give to my beloved Brother Richard Williamson one Negro boy slave
named Mose of from fourteen to eighteen years old to him the said Paul
Williamson & his heirs forever: I appoint & constitute my friend John W. Kib-
bly to be the Executor of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and caused my seal to be affixed this 25th day of
October 1820. Signed, sealed & acknowledged
