3 Third I will and bequeath unto my Beloved Daughter Mary Morton one negro Girl named Chain which is now in her possession also one negro woman named Mariah at her disposal to act as she thinks proper with also the little Gray mare also the Lands known as the Hill place and the Lands belonging to me that Again the same: Also one tract containing Two Hundred and Fifty (250) Acres more or Less Granted to Ann Harris also one tract of fifty (50) Acres more or Less Adjoining: Granted to H. Garrison all of which property is given to her for her sole Benefit and at her death to the heirs of her Body and not to be at the disposal of her ^{Stephen Co. Ga. 4 Fourth I will and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Cephy Hunt in trust to my Son Barrell Phillips and my friend Noel Vanier and they are to be considered as her sole Trustees the following property: To wit one negro Girl named Lyle which is now in her possession also Ben Rears Charity Eliza John & Abigail Sam and Sampson: Also one mare known by the name of Holly also the Lands known as Morton tract Purchased from Robert Beville containing: Two Hundred and nine (209) Acres also one tract Granted to David Morton containing one Hundred (100) Acres: Also one tract purchased from John Williams containing Thirteen (13) Acres also one tract purchased from David Thorne containing Two Hundred (200) Acres: Also one tract containing Twenty five (25) Acres more or Less Granted to Charles: Fourths also one tract containing Fifty (50) Acres more or Less Granted to Richard Phillips. I also will and bequeath to my daughter Cephy Hunt at the

death or widowhood of my wife Ann Phillips the follow-
