impressed with the belief that I shall ere long have to leave this
world and under these solemn considerations I have thought pro-
per to make a declaration Relative to my worldly affairs in
declaring this my last will and testament as follows
I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Fanniney
Searbrough all my Lands lying and being in said County
on the waters of Horse Creek and adjoining Lands of James
Parker and A. C. Brinson and others also one other tract
No 222 two hundred and twenty nine on the waters of Horse
Creek in the County of DeKalb in said State also the stock
embracing every kind that I have together with all the Tools
and appertinances now on the place also the following named
negro Slaves to wit Bob, Sam, Berry, Solomon, Rollin,
Padah, Mariah, Sarah, Harriet, and Caroline, during her
natural life and at her death I desire and do give and bequeath
all of the above named Lands to my beloved Son
Elias The balance of the property given to my beloved wife
as above stated I wish her to do and act with as I shall
deem best to her and her judgment at her death
Given under my hand this the second day of September
in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and forty two
