

In the name of God Amen. I Reuben Wilkinson of the County of Screven & State of Georgia, being in good health, and of sound mind and memory thank be unto God; knowing that it is ordained for all men once to die - that I may be prepared for that event, so far as respects my worldly affairs, whenever it may please Divine providence to call me hence, do make and ordain this as my last will and testament. Vt. -

1st. To the great and Supreme God who gave me life, do I recommend my soul, trusting he will raise it from the dead & clothe it with everlasting life, not for my own good deeds, but through the mercy and atonement of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

And my debts of course are to be paid which my Executrix will settle as soon as possible she can, without waiting for the expiration of the year, or for actions to be commenced thereon. - 2nd. To my beloved wife Ann D. W. Wilkinson do I give & bequeath all my lands negroes stock of all kinds farming utensils, household & kitchen furniture, together with all monies debts & indeed every thing in the way of property, both real & personal that I am now possessed of, to be held by her and her heirs forever.

3rd. I do hereby appoint & constitute my beloved wife Ann D. W. Wilkinson my sole &

my Executors, hereby revoking & annulling all former Wills by me made. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of July in the
year of our Lord 1828. Signed, sealed & acknowledged in presence of us, and each of us
have signed in presence of the others.

In the name of God, Amen. I Cloton Foythness of the County of Screven & State
of Georgia (Planter), being weak in body & health but of perfect mind & memory, thank
be given to God, and calling to mind the morality of my body & knowing that it is ap-
pointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this, my last Will & Testament,
that is to say, principally, I do hereby recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that give it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executor, nothing doubting but
at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God
to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following man-
ner & form, viz. First I give & bequeath to my father Meredith Foythness one Cow
and calf. Also I will & bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Foythness my two negroes,
viz. Mollie & her child Lucy on her paying to my brother Meredith Foythness and
my niece Sarah Elizabeth Foythness one hundred dollars each. Also I will
and bequeath that my Executor will have so much of my cattle I hope & horses
sold as will pay all my just & lawful debts, & the balance of all my stock to equally
divided between my sister Elizabeth Foythness & my brother Meredith Foythness &
my niece Sarah Elizabeth Foythness. And I the aforesaid Cloton Foythness
do constitute, make & ordain Hope Foythness of the County & State aforesaid my sole
Executor of this my last & only Will & Testament & I do hereby utterly disannul,
revoke & disavow any other former legacies, bequest, will or Testament confirming &
ratifying this & no other to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this the eighteenth day of July in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight. Signed, sealed, published, pronounced by the said
Cloton Foythness as his last Testament, in the presence of us, who in his presence & in the
presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names.
