1. Item: I hereby nominate & appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Cooper executrix of this my last will & testament.

2. Item: I desire & direct that my executors shall in the event of my death, provided, as soon as is practicable, to sell either at public or private sale or in any other manner to dispose of, as shall seem in her discretion to be best for my family & creditors, so much of my estate either real or personal or both as shall be necessary to discharge all my just debts.

3. Item: I desire & direct that after my debts shall have been paid, the property of whatever kind remaining, shall be kept & managed by my executrix for the support of herself and our children, & for the education of the latter, & in order to accomplish their purposes, it is my will that she have power to sell, buy, or exchange; to remove from place to place or from state to state; & in short, that she shall have as full & entire control over all such property, as I would myself, were I living.

4. Item: Whenever one of my children shall become of full age, or when one of my daughters shall marry, then ^{Sc生生 Co. Ga. Will Book 2-B (1808-1879) and that in each case} shall in each case all my estate shall be divided into as many equal shares as there shall be children living & my beloved wife counted with them and one of these equal shares shall be placed in the hands of a trustee or trustees for the benefit of such daughter and her children, should she have any, and shall not be subjected to the debts or liabilities of her husband, nor be disposed of in any way by him - And should my wife marry again, she shall be entitled to a child's part of the property as in the case of the marriage of a daughter - And in that event ~~it is~~ ^{is} my desire that she turn over all the remaining property belonging to the children into the hands of a trustee or trustees -

5. Item: If it should be necessary to appoint a trustee as provided for in item 4, above, I desire that my dear brother in law, Francis B. Stewart, now of the State of Texas, shall be appointed such trustee, if living; & if he is not, then my brother in law, George W. Stewart, of the same state; & if he is not living, then my brother in law, James D. Stewart, also of the same state, if he is living; and in the event of none of them living in life, then the trustee or trustees to be appointed by the court of the county having such power whenever the property may be at the time.
