I, Hugh Kirkpatrick being now in sound mind and
State of perfect disposing memory, knowing the uncertainty of life, do hereby
make this my last will and testament for the disposition of my - after my death.
Item 1st. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
Christianlike manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal
salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed.
Item 2nd. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay
by my executors hereinafter appointed.
Item 3rd. I give and bequeath to my beloved and affectionate wife the home
and lot in which I now reside in the city of Macon and all the land
thereunto belonging, which lay on the north eastern side of the Macon &
Western road for and during her natural life with full power to dis-
pose of the same by will or otherwise. This is given in lieu of all my
wife's other interest in my other lands and real estate. I give and be-
queath also to my wife one fourth part of all my negroes, she having
the power to select such negroes as she may think will best suit her -
reference being had to their value, and keeping the families of my
negroes together - and at the death of - wife it is my will that all
the negroes and their natural increase shall revert back and become
the absolute property of my children living at the time of my wife's death
and in case any of my children should depart this life before my wife having
children then my grandchildren shall inherit the share to which their
mother would have been entitled had she been living. My wife has
only a life interest in the negroes given to her in this item. I give also to my
wife absolutely one fourth part of all my feeble property.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Ellen M, the wife of George W Grant of Meriwether County to her sole and separate use free from the debts contracts and liabilities of her present or any future husband that she may have - the one fourth part of all my estate both real & personal except my residence which I have given to my wife, for and during her natural life, and at her death the said property shall vest in her children living at the time of her death, and should any of her children die leaving children then such grand children shall inherit the share to which their parents would have been entitled to. I direct that as each of my grand children arrive at the age of twenty one years or marry they shall receive one half of the property to which they are entitled to under this item, the other half at the discretion or death of their surviving parent. I appoint my son in law George W Grant Trustee for my said daughter Ellen M Grant. He two negroes Nancy and Cora whom I loaned to my daughter Ellen M Grant shall be accounted for at the distribution of my estate at twelve hundred dollars without interest, and at the distribution of my estate it is my wish that Jennie the daughter of Nancy should go to my daughter Ellen at a fair valuation in order that my negroes may go to my children in families as far as possible.

Item 5th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna M the wife of Cractus W Beck of Spalding County to her sole and separate use free from the debts contracts and liabilities of her present or any future husband that she may have - the one fourth part of all my estate both real and personal except my residence which I have given to my wife for and during her natural life, and at her death the said property shall vest in her children living at the time of her death, and should any of her children die leaving children then such grand children shall inherit the share to which their parent would have been entitled to. And I direct that as each of my grand children arrive at the age of twenty one years or marry that they shall receive one half of the property to which they are entitled to under this item, and the other half at the discretion or death of their surviving parent. I appoint my son in law Cractus W Beck Trustee for my said daughter Anna M Beck. The negro woman Emily whom I have loaned my daughter Anna M Beck shall be accounted for at the distribution of my estate at seven hundred dollars without interest.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Alice Parks Kirkpatrick to her sole and separate use free from the debts contracts and liabilities of any husband that she may have - one fourth part of - estate both real and personal except my residence which I - given to my wife for and during her natural life, and at her death the said property shall vest in her children living at the time of her death, and should any of her children die leaving children then such grand children shall inherit the share to which their parents would have been entitled to. And I direct that as each of my grand children arrive at the

age of twenty one years or more they shall receive one half of the property to which they are entitled to under this item and the other half at the discretion or death of their surviving parent I appoint Erasmus M Beck & George H Grant Trustees for my daughter Alice.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my wife all of my household and kitchen furniture and my family carriage.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my first born grand son Hugh I Grant my gold watch that I wear about my person and I request that this watch will not be permitted to go out of the family and in case of his death it shall go to the next oldest grandson.

Item 6th I hereby appoint and constitute my wife, George H Grant and Erasmus M Beck my executrix and executors of this my last will and testament I instruct my executors not to chop or sell of my plantation or to distribute the negroes under two full years and only then at the end of the year, but to sell all my other lands either at public or private sales and on such terms as to payments as they may think best And I direct that as long as my daughter Anna occupy the brick house free of rent my daughter Ellen shall receive One hundred fifty dollars annually as compensation for rent.
