Containing 184 acres more or less. Also part of No 11 consisting of 100. acres all now lying or
being in Spalding County State of Georgia. 2^d Item I desire my son Frothingham to have a
horse worth one hundred dollars, when he becomes twenty one years of age to be made equal
with my three sons namely. Jesse D. David W. & James W. who have had horses to the value of one

hundred dollars. Item 3d: It is my will that at the death of my beloved wife, that all the property shall be sold & my Daughter to have the amount of our hundred dollars, to be made equal parts my four Sons, & the balance to be equally divided between my children Item 4: I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved wife Polly Davis, Executor, & my worthy friend Edmund B. Leach, Executor of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I James Davis have to this my will, consisting of one half sheet of paper, set my hand & seal this 26th day of March 1855.
