that I must shortly depart this life deem it right
and proper that I should make a disposition
of the property with which a kind Providence has
blessed me do therefore make this my last will
and testament

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
decent and Christian like manner suitable to
my circumstances and condition in life my soul
I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
by executors hereafter appointed

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son
John Milton Westmoreland nine negroes to wit Dudley
a man about thirty three years (33) of age and his
wife Malinda a woman about thirty years (30) of age
and her four children Hulda Charles Rufus and
Jane also one negro man named Frank about
twenty years (20) of age and Mark about fifteen
years (15) of age and one negro girl named Judy
about Eighteen years (18) of age

I also direct that my executors sell or rent my town
property consisting of dwelling house and lot and
store house and lot house lot and kitchen furni-
ture at any time they judge for the best interest of my soul
to give and bequeath to my son John Milton Westmore-
land all of the residue of my effects not before dis-
posed of after all my just debts are paid

I direct that my son John Milton Westmoreland
receive a Collegiate Education should his health
and other circumstances not forbid

I also direct that should it be the will of a kind
Providence to call my son John Milton Westmoreland
from this Earth to Eternity before he arrives to
the age of Twenty one (21) I direct that all my property
be equally divided between my brothers and sisters
with the exception of Robert I Westmoreland I desire
by this my last will and testament to cut him off
from all of my effects in any manner whatever
should my son John Milton Westmoreland be called
from hence

I direct that my beloved Brother Mark W Westmoreland
act as Guardian for the person and property of my

my son John Milton Westmoreland and in
 case should my Bro M W Westmoreland die
 before my said John Milton Westmoreland becomes
 of age I desire that my Brother Calvin Westmore-
 land take the Guardianship of my son John
 Milton Westmoreland

Wherby constitute my beloved Brothers
 Calvin Westmoreland and Mark W Westmoreland
 Executors of this my last will and testament

 and considering the uncertainty of life this frail
 and transitory life do therefore make ordain
 publish and declare this to be my last Will and
 Testament this is to say first after all my lawful
 debts are paid and discharged the residue of
 my Estate real and personal I give bequeath
 and dispose of as follows to wit to my wife
 Nancy Blessit the land as follows One Hundred
 and forty five acres being a part of lot No
 one hundred and thirtieth and part of lot No
 one hundred and forty four in being in the
 third of Menros when Surveyed now Spalding
 County also bequeath unto my wife Nancy
 Blessit three negroes namely Milton a man
 eighteen years of age Milly a woman fifty or
 sixty years of age Lewis a girl between nine
 and eleven years of age and the choice one
 of all my horses two choice cows and calves
 two beds and bedsteads and clothing Cart
 and Steer and five of the best fidding Hags
 and two sows and pigs the remainder of
 my property to except the negroes to be sold
 and equally divided among my five children
 I bequeath unto my five children namely
 Nancy S Blessit William S Blessit Clay Ann
