The undersigned J. A. Campbell A. A. Saulding and Wm. Crittenden residing in the County of Spalding State of Georgia were present on Wednesday the fifth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three at the residence of William W. Wiggins, a married man before and at the time of his death about thirty six hours before his death in perfect possession of his Mental faculties. he called upon us to remember and take notice of what he was about to say That it had been his intention to make his Will in writing and dispose of his property some time before but as it was not convenient for him to do so at the time he had neglected it. Since He now wished us to understand that his will and desire was that his personal estate, of every sort and description lying and being in the County of Burke and State aforesaid should be kept together as heretofore in the Superintendence of his Brother Amos Wiggins until the death of said Amos or the marriage or becoming of age of either of his Children upon the happening of either of which events then the whole of his estate to be equally divided between his wife Mary Ann and his Children Ella S. E. Clifford W. and Henry A. and that he requested and desired his brother Amos Wiggins and his wife Mary Ann to see that his wishes and desires in this regard should be fully carried into effect. about thirty six hours after which he died of the disease with which he was then afflicted October 11. 1853

I Elisha Atkins of the County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory Blessed be God for it but being in bad health and knowing that I must shortly die think it just and right both as respects myself and family that I should make a disposition of the property with which kind Providence has blessed me I therefore Ordain this writing to be my last Will and Testament in Manner following and first I bequeath my body to the dust in decent Burial suitable to my Circumstances and my Soul to God who gave it Secondly I direct my Executors hereinafter appointed to pay off my Just debts as soon as possible for it is my desire that my Creditors should not be delayed in their Just rights
