Item 4th I give and bequeath to Thaddeus Brooks son of Ruthy Brooks the sum of fifty dollars

Item 5th I give and bequeath to Josiah Mulligan the sum of twelve hundred dollars

Item 6th I give and bequeath to Martha Mulligan the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars

Item 7th I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Mulligan the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars

Item 3rd I will & bequeath to wife as aforesaid my negro man Sam whom she may sell publickly or privately as she may deem proper if it should be necessary to do so in order to pay my debts, the residue of the proceeds of said sale after the payments of my debts to be hers absolutely - If it be not necessary to sell said Negro then I will him to her absolutely

Item 4th I desire my debts to be paid out of the proceeds of my Cotton crop or other moneys I may be possessed of or that may be due me at that time; if after paying my debts out of said funds there be a residue remaining that I will also to my wife

Item 5th I hereby appoint my wife my Executor to this my last will & testament - Signed sealed & the day & year }
above written in our presence who have hereunto } Jno. M. Tilley D
subscribed our Names as witnesses at the request }
of the testator in his presence & in the presence }
