 2nd Item I devise and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by
 my executors hereinafter appointed as I am unwilling my Creditors should
 be delayed in their rights
 3rd Item — I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Martha Altha Crawford
 one hundred dollars, and one Feather-bed and furniture
 4th Item I give bequeath and devise to my Grand daughter Martha A. C.
 Johnson one hundred dollars
 5th Item The residue of my property both real and personal wherever and what
 —soever it may be I give bequeath and devise to my three daughters, to-wit,
 Mary P. Johnson, Belia Ann Johnson and Ebiltha Louisa Johnson to be equally
 divided between them
 6th Item. I hereby Constitute and Appoint my daughter Ebiltha Louisa Johnson
 Executrix, and my worthy friend William W. Moore Executor of this
 my last will and testament this September 8th 1855.
