A. Elizabeth Christopher's Will and Testament

to die do make this my last Will and testament; first of all

Item 1<sup>st</sup> my will and wish is that the tract of land  
that I have drawn in the late Land lottery be sold and equal  
by division between all my grand Children namely Thomas  
Christopher, Perkins and Elizabeth and Nancy and Fannie.  
Item 2<sup>d</sup> I hereby appoint my friend Richard Asberry my  
legal Executor, in presence of this 21<sup>st</sup> of April 1837.

### James D. Gresham's Will

In the name of God Amen —

I James D. Gresham of the County of Taliaferro and State of Georgia, considering the brevity of this mortal life and calling to mind that it is appointed that man must die and being weak in body, but of sound mind, and disposing memory, do make and ordain this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I will that all my just debts be first paid out of the property I may die possessed of.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Gresham the following property viz, Negro boy Bob nearly grown Rachel a woman about twenty five years old. Hettie a girl about fourteen or fifteen and Sophia about ten years old also one Gray Mare and one bay horse four first Choice of Cows and Calves, Ten first Choice of Sheep and all my flock of hogs, all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and one hundred barrels of Corn, six stacks of fodder, twenty bushels of oats, two plow and plow gear complete, two working horses and all that part of my land lying north of the Greensborough Road and south and little river containing two hundred acres more or less with free privilege to the spring on the south side of said Road, to have during her natural life or widowhood, one cart and yoke Oxen, and shucks.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> It is my will and desire that if my wife becomes dissatisfied with living on the land will be to her that my Executors herein after named, purchase a suitable place for her and her Children and die peace of the place wherein I now reside, together with all my property not hereto fore or hereinafter, for County Wills 1826-1866 as they in their discretion may see fit.
