Item 2nd I hereby appoint my friend Richard Asberry my
legal Executor, in presents of, this 21st of April 1827.

James D. Grisham's Will

In the name of God Amen —

I, James D. Grisham of the County of Italiaferro and State
of Georgia, Considering the shortness this mortal life and
calling to mind that it is appointed that man must die
and bring weak in body, but of sound mind, and disposing
memory, do make and ordain this my last will & Testament.
Inprimis, I will, that all my just debts be first paid out of
the property I may die possessed of.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary-
Grisham the following property (viz) Negro boy Bob nearly
grown Rachel a woman about twenty five years old, Hetty
a girl about fourteen or fifteen and Sophia about ten years old
also one Gray Mare and one bay horse four first Choice of
boies and Calves, Ten first Choice of sheep and all my stock
of hogs, all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and
one hundred barrel of Corn, Six stacks of fodder, twenty
bushels of oats, two plows and plow gear complete, two
wring hoes and all that part of my land lying north of the
Greenborough Road and south and little river. Containing
hundred acres more or less with free privilege to the spring
on the south side of said Road, to have during her natural
life or widowhood, one Cart and yoke Oxen, and trucks.

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that if my wife becomes
dissatisfied with living on the land willed to her that my
Executor, herein after named, purchase a suitable place for
her and her Children and dispose of the place whereon
I now reside, together with all my property not hereto-
fore or hereinafter bequeathed by this will as they in their
discretion may think proper.
