Item the second - I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza Elizabeth & my five Children, to wit, Richard, Jefferson Nancy Ann, Elizabeth, Treasia Ann, Sarah Francis Georgia Ann, all my lands for them to have & to hold unto & with my wife & Children to remain together & live on said land untill all the Children become of age at which time it will be necessary to make a distribution which distribution I wish made by dividing the lands equally among them all so that each one is to share & share a like

Item the third - I want as early as consistent all my perishable property & stock of every kind not necessary to, to remain with my family for the Comfort & Convenience of the same to be disposed of by sale, the proceeds of which I wish to go to the payment of my just debts & the support of my wife & Children in Common

I wish my Uncle Jonathan Gunn & my wife Eliza Elizabeth Gunn to act as my executors after my death Given under my hand & seal this ^{thirty} eighth of Oct.
