gave it. Item the 1st I lend to my Daughter Elizabeth
one negro Girl named Sealew during her natural life
time, and then to go to her Children, and for Elizabeth
to have said negro at my death.

Item 2nd I wish is for Lucy and Ceaser to be hired
until my youngest Child John arrives to the age of
twenty one years of age then my desire is for the negroes
to be sold, and the money equally to be divided between my
son Littlebury Jefferson, and John Mulkey, and the proceeds
of the negroes. - Item 3rd my wish is that all my property
both real and personal be sold by my Executor as soon
as the nature of the case will admit of and my debts
be paid. - my wish is the above to be complied
with by my Executor. - I constitute and appoint William
Little my Executor to this my last will and testament, in
Witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of
February 1827.
