 in possession of subjecting it to the Payment of all my just debts, for
 her to act with said property in the following manner, I wish my said
 wife to keep all my Children who are single with her untill they arrive
 to the age of twenty one years and also to give each of them a good English
 education and as each of my said Children shall arrive at twenty one
 years of age it is my will that said property in this Item shall be appra-
 ised and divided equally among my Children mentioned in this Item and
 my said wife, she to receive a Childs part of said property, and on the
 arrival of all the rest of said Children at the age of twenty one years,
 then and in that Case for said property to be appraised again, and their
 part set off to them, and so on untill my youngest shall arrive at
 twenty one years of age

If my wife should have a child in a reasonable time after my
 death it is my will for it to share with the rest of ~~the~~ Children in this
 Item — In Testimony whereof I have in presence

 Jacob B. Hendrick was produced in open Court by Sharon T. Hendrick
 for probate and in Common Form of law was proven by the Interrog-
 -atories of Jo^l. Brooke & James B. Brooke two of the subscribing witnesses
 to said will — It was Ordered by the Court that the will and proceeding
 thereon be recorded — and that letters of administration be issued to
 with the will annexed to the said Sharon T. Hendrick — The 10th day
 of January 1848. Witness the Hon. Buford Bird one of the Justices of said
 Court & recorded Jan 10th 1848.

State of Georgia } Know all men by these presents that Richard
Valdiero County } Parker of the State and County aforesaid being of
sound and disposing mind, best of advanced age,

and knowing that it is appointed for man once to die, do make and
ordain this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all
other wills here tofore made - and first I recommend my soul to
God who gave it, and my body to the grave to be buried in a
decent manner, also in a Christian like burial at the discretion
of my Executors, not doubting that I shall receive the same at
the general resurrection at the last day. And as respecting my
worldly matters (I mean my estate) which the Lord has gave me
I give and dispose of in the following manner, to wit,

Item 1st I wish my just debts to be paid first

Item 2nd I give to my daughter Anna Johnson and her husband
Henry Johnson the use and privilege of the house in which
they now live, also the spring out of which they now use
and two acres of land around the house, also the benefit of
wood and timber, any wheres near the house, for their use
while they live, and three negroes viz, Comfort and two boys
John and Isaiah for their use and benefit while they live
these to be the property of my three grand daughters, viz, Mary
Cecilia and Tobitha Louisa Johnson and give to my said
daughter Anna Johnson the one fourth of my estate which is
not other wise willed

Item 3rd I give to my Daughter Molly ten Dollars and no more

Item 4th I give to the heirs of my deceased son William Parker,
two negroes, viz, Willie and Henry, and after certain reserves
that is to say, one half acre of land the graves in the center
for a family grave yard and the reserve made to my
daughter Anna, and Henry Johnson and the land given to my
grandson Joseph Robert Parker. and my daughter Bethena
Wilson then I give to the six youngest sons of my son
son William Parker the remaining part of my land and
plantation

Item 5th I give to my daughter Belia Caldwell fifty dollars and
four ewes and lambs.

Item 6th I give to my Daughter Tobitha ~~Johnson~~ Seven negroes
viz, Jim, ~~John~~, ~~William~~, ~~James~~, ~~John~~, ~~James~~, ~~John~~, ~~James~~
