James D. Gresham's Will

In the name of God Amen —

I James D. Gresham of the County of Taliaferro and State of Georgia, considering the brevity of this mortal life and calling to mind that it is appointed that man must die and being weak in body, but of sound mind, and desiring memory, do make and ordain this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof, I will that all my just debts be first paid out of the property I may die possessed of.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Gresham the following property viz, Negro boy Bob nearly grown Rachel a woman about twenty five years old. Lett a girl about fourteen or fifteen and Sophia about ten years old also one Gray Mare and one bay horse four first Choice of Cows and Calves, ten first Choice of Sheep and all my stock of hogs, all my house hold and kitchen furniture, an one hundred barrels of Corn, six stacks of fodder, twenty bushels of oats, two plow and plow gear complete, two inghers and all that part of my land lying north of the Greensborough Road and south and little river containing two hundred acres more or less with free privilege to the spring on the south side of said Road, to have during her natural life or widowhood, one cart and yoke Oxen, and shucks.

Item 3^d It is my will and desire that if my wife becomes dissatisfied with living on the land willed to her that my Executors herein after named, purchase a suitable place for her and her children and dispose of the place wherein I now reside, together with all my property not heretofore or hereinafter for County Wills 1826-1866 as they in their discretion may think best.

Item 1st It is my will and desire that my Children remain
with my Wife for the ensuing year, and that my Executors furnish
them out of the proceeds of my present Crop of Cotton with sugar
& coffee \$6.—

Item 2nd I have heretofore given my Daughter Caroline D. Tunnele
formerly Caroline D. Graham bed bedstead and furniture and other
articles estimated to be worth Fifty Dollars, and it is my will &
desire that my other children Big J. Nancy C. Graham, Jane J. Gresham
James D. Graham, Mary Cecilia Ann Graham, Sarah Ann.
Graham and John Thomas Graham receive in money or property
the amount given to my Daughter Caroline D. Tunnele as
aforesaid mentioned after which is my will and desire
that all my property be divided equally share and share alike
between all beforementioned children so they become of lawfull
age, or intermarry.

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that my Executors hereinafter
named should hire for my daughter Caroline D. Tunnele one
negro woman and one negro Girl untill my estate shall be
so arranged that she shall receive her proportionable part
which is to be paid for out of my estate without any expense
to my daughter Caroline D.—

Item 4th It is my will and desire and I do hereby constitute and
appoint Archibald G. Jones and John H. Graham my lawfull
Executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal in the presence of this
the 26th of December 1829.

Know ye, that on the Eleventh day of January 1830. the last Will &
testament of James D. Gresham late of said County deceased, was

deceased, having in his lifetime, and at the time of his death, had
dever, goods, rights, and credits within the County aforesaid, by
means whereof, the approbation and allowing of the Testament

belong; They have therefore, granted and committed the admini-

George ³ In the name of God, Amen.
Taliaferro County, I Francis Butler of the County and State
above mentioned Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and
being of sound mind and memory, blessed be almighty God for
the same, ^{make} to establish this ^{as} my last Will and Testament, in manner
and form following (that is to say). —

First.— That all my just debts shall be paid.

Secondly.— I give unto my son Edward Butler, my bay Coalt. To my single
Daughter Hannah Butler, I give my bay Mare, Bow and Balf. — and the
money that belonged to the said Hannah Butler at the death of her
Father Edmond Butler Decd. that I made use of in the purchase
of the Tract of land that I know hold in the above County, and
my present residence, that the said Daughter Hannah shall be
paid the full amount of money made use of, and Interest there-
on, To my Daughter Mary Rudicell wife John Rudicell; and Ann
Wooten widow of James Wooten Decd. — To share equal in a bay
horse called Roanoke — To my son in law James Daniel, who married
my Daughter Mourning Butler, know Decd. — one Dollar. — And lastly,
to all the rest, residues and remainder of my Real and personal
estate, Goods and chattels, to be sold and equally divided between the
following Legatees. — Edward Butler, Hannah Butler, Mary Rudi-

cell, wife of John Rudicell, and for the remainder of James Wooten, Esq.
