I James Reid being of sound disposing mind and memory and knowing that life is uncertain and that all must die and being desirous to appoint the manner of the distribution of my property among my children I ordain and establish the following to be my last will and testament revoking all other previously made.

1<sup>st</sup>. I command my soul and body to my Creator who gave them existence.

2<sup>nd</sup>. I desire my just debts to be paid as soon after my death as possible.

3<sup>rd</sup>. I give and bequeath to my daughter Amanda during her natural life and no longer, and for her sole and separate use my negro boy Spencer and my negro girl Manilia - at her death to go to her children Children if she should die leaving any living - but if she should die leaving no child or children living then I desire said negroes and their increase to be equally divided share and share alike between the following of my children, Tomit, Ann Sekew, Martha J. Burch, Sarah W. Cotton, Mary Emonton, Susan Williams, James R. M. Reid, John J. Reid and William J. Reid and should either of my said children be dead then that ones share to go to his or her children Children - 3<sup>rd</sup> Fourth - the balance of my estate I desire to go to my son John J. Reid - to be held and managed by him for the sole and separate use of my beloved wife Rebecca for and during her natural life, to be fully accounted for by him at her death, and distributed as follows - to wit, twelve hundred and fifty five dollars to be paid to my daughter Amanda in the same manner and with the same restrictions & limitations as the bequest to her of the boy & girl Spencer & Manilia - the balance to be equally divided between my said children (share & share alike), Tomit, Ann Sekew, Martha Burch, Sarah W. Cotton, Mary Emonton, Susan Williams, James R. M. Reid, John J. Reid, William J. Reid and Amanda Reid, the said Amanda's share being bequeathed to her in the same manner and with the same limitations & restrictions as the said bequest herein before mentioned of the said negro boy & girl Spencer & Manilia - fifth - As the children of my beloved deceased daughter Elizabeth Park are all well provided for in this world I bequeath them nothing of my property sixth - The property bequeathed to my daughter Amanda I desire to be managed by my son John J. for her, to the best advantage & for her comfort and happiness - seventh - I appoint & constitute my son John J.
