 this my last will and testament, hereby (revoking) all others, I give and
 Bequeath to my Mother Amelia Bowles one tract of land lying and
 being in the County of Monroe in the twelfth district known by No.
 117th. But at her death to go to Brother Benjamin B. Bowles, Also I
 give unto her during her life two head of horses, eight head of cattle
 more or less, one feather bed and furniture, one bed stid, One Walnut
 Chest during her life, and at her death all the above mentioned
 property to go to Brother Benjamin B. Bowles, Also at the death of my
 mother Amelia Bowles, I give to Brother Benjamin B. Bowles, all my part
 of the estate which is coming to me at her death, One negro man
 by the name of Mill. One fourth part of a negro woman, by the name
 of patient, and one fourth part of a tract of land where one Amos
 Bowles now lives, also one half of seven young negroes, one by
 the name of Madison, one by the name of Eliza, one by
 the name of Ester, one by the name of Crawford, one
 the name of Dick, one girl by the name of Susan, and
 a boy by the name of Clark which is to be divided at the death
 of my mother, also I give to Brother Benjamin B. Bowles one Rifle
 Gun and silver Watch for him to convert to his own use, or what
 ever he may think proper, But at the death of Amelia Bowles
 I shall give to Brother Benjamin B. Bowles, and to sister Mary Bennett,
 the sum of Ten dollars each, Given under my hand and seal
 this the Twentieth day of May Eighteen hundred and twenty
 seven,

B. Bowles, Executor. Witness the honorable Hermon Mercer one of the Judges of the said Court of Ordinary, second day of July 1827 in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and Twenty seven.

Also all my stock of all kinds household and kitchen furniture of all kind, farming utensils &c. I give and bequeath to Timothy Brinsford of ^{my} daughter Polly fifty dollars as his part of my estate. I also give to Isaac Veazey Son of Zebekiel Veazey, my son fifty dollars for his part of my estate. The Balance of my Property I wish to be equally divided. Return my children at the death of my Wife Nancy Veazey. I hereby appoint my son J. Veazey my son Executor of this my last Will and testament hereby Revoking all former Wills by me made in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th December 1826.
