herebefore made by me Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Nancy during her natural life and after her death to my son William J. Phillips the following property, to wit, the plantation on which I now reside except one hundred and twenty five acres including the houses in which Thomas J. Lewis now resides and one hundred and twenty five acres including the houses in which Henry J. Phillips now resides the disposition of which is herein after mentioned also I give without reserve to my wife Nancy my Negro girl Little Mary about thirteen years of age I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife in reserve for my Children at her death my Negro Man Isaac thirty five years of age Dorcas a Negro woman about sixty five years of age and Phillips a Negro woman forty five years of age also all of the house-hold and kitchen furniture stock of horses, hogs Cattle &c and plantation tools necessary to keep up the farm also a Negro woman named Mary Hines five years of age in reserve for Henry J. Phillips Children at her death Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give bequeath and devise to my son William J. Phillips Dicey a Negro woman about twenty seven years of age and at the death of my wife Nancy Mary a Negro woman thirty five years of age also one hundred & twenty five Acres of land including the houses in which Henry J. Phillips now resides said land to be laid out or measured off by my Executors herein after mentioned

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give bequeath and devise to my son William J. Phillips Lucy my Negro girl about eighteen years of age and Alfred about thirteen years of age also at the death of my wife I give and bequeath to my son William J. Phillips the plantation on which I now reside as given to my wife Nancy in Item first

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give bequeath and devise unto my son William J. Phillips as Trustee for my Daughter Elizabeth Lewis and all her Children freed from the disposition of her present or any future husband my Negro girl Bet about thirteen years old and Deal my negro woman about twenty four years of age and also one hundred and twenty five Acres of land including the houses in which Thomas J. Lewis now resides to be laid out or measured off by my Executors herein after mentioned

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy a supply of the (240) provisions for one year after my death

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I desire that at my death all the surplus of stock and provision after my wife has sufficient herself shall be sold and my just debt paid and the remainder divided into three equal parts, viz, one to my son William J. Phillips for his own use and benefit, one to William J. Phillips as Trustee for the heirs of Henry J. Phillips one third to my son William J. Phillips as Trustee for my Daughter Elizabeth Lewis and all her children from from the disposition of her present or any future husband also at the Death of my wife Isaac Dorcas & Phillips to be sold and the proceeds divided in the same manner

Item 7<sup>th</sup> I hereby Constitute and appoint my son William J. Phillips and my worthy friend William A. Dyne Executors of this my last will and testament this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June 1853. John Phillips Esq<sup>r</sup> <sup>mark</sup>

Greeting

I know Ye, That on the fourth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred and fifty four the last will and testament of John Phillips late of said County deceased, was exhibited in open Court, and in Common form of law proved and admitted to record, a Copy of which is annexed; an Administration of the estate, real and personal, of said deceased, was granted to William A. Phillips the executor on and by said will named and appointed he having first taken the Oath, and performed all other requisites required by law, he is by Order of said Court, and by virtue of these presents, legally authorized to Administer the estate, real and personal, of the said deceased, according to the tenor and effect of the said will and testament, and according to law. And he is hereby required to render a true and perfect inventory of all the estate, both real and personal, of the said deceased, and have the same appraised and returned to this Court according to law, and to render a true and correct account to the said Court, of his actions and doings yearly and every year until his Administration is fully completed.
