 his own judgment and discretion

Item 2nd The Negro Woman Rachel though for many years in my possession

I admit to be the property of my brother Alexander H. Stephens

Item 3rd I also appoint my said brother Alexander H. Stephens Executor of this
 my last Will with all the powers before declared, In witness of all
 which I have hereunto set my hand and seal and published and declared
 the foregoing as my last Will and Testament the 7th day of June 1856.
