Item 4th I desire my debts to be paid out of the proceeds of my Cotton Crop or other money I may die possessed of or that may be due me at that time; if after paying my debts out of said funds there be a residue remaining that I will also to my wife

Item 5th I hereby appoint my wife my Executor to this my my last will & testament - signed sealed & the day & year
