Item 2<sup>nd</sup>. I will and bequeath unto the three children of my brother Silas Stephens, to wit, Sarah E. Stephens, Mary A. Stevens and Albert B. Stephens all the balance of my estate both real and personal, after my just debts are paid share and share alike to be paid to them as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>. It is my will and desire that my Executor herein after appointed may sell any or all of my real estate without an Order of Court either at public or private sale as he may think best.

Lastly, I hereby nominate Constitute and appoint my brother Silas

Stevens Executor to this my last Will and Testament. (The word "be" interlined before signed.) In testimony whereof I have

Letter testamentary to Piles Stevens

State of Georgia By the Court of Ordinary for said County
