Item 1st After the payment of all my just debts I give and bequeath to my wife Malinda Jarrett during her natural life all of my estate both personal and real

Item 2nd It is my will and desire that at the death of my wife one half of my estate shall be equally divided between my two sisters Louisa Arnold of the County of Calhoun this state and Ephronia Bowen of the County of Randolph this State

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that the other half of my estate at my wifes death be disposed of as she may will

Item 4th It is my will and desire that in case my sister Ephronia Bowen should die before my wife that the portion of my estate bequeathed to her shall be bequeathed as my wife may desire and not go to the heirs of my sister Ephronia Bowen unless it be the will of my wife;

Item 5th It is my will and desire that my Brother George W. Jarrett and my wife Malinda Jarrett act as executors to this my last will and testament. - Signed in the presence of the following witnesses who witnessed his signature - and whose signatures I witnessed this the 7th day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and Fifty three (1853)

 David E. Darden I do hereby nominate & appoint him to be my Executor
- Item 3rd Having the Misfortune to have Four Children by a Colored woman
 named Rose) which Children are now the property of one Jethro
 Darden & named as follows Alphonse, Hilary, Gilbert & Minerva I hereby
 will & bequeath to my Executor aforesaid the sum of fifteen hundred
 dollars the interest of which during his said David E. Darden's life
 he is to pay over to the use & benefit of said Children as he may
 see fittest
- Item 4th I will that the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars said
 David E. Darden shall at his death dispose of by will as he
 may Choose & in event of his failing to make a will, said
 fifteen hundred dollars shall become the property of his
 said David E. Darden's lawful heirs
- Item 5th I will & bequeath the residue of my Estate to my lawful
 heirs to be equally divided amongst them as the law
 directs
