The last will and Testament of Joseph Campbell of Calistro County
and State of Georgia. Joseph Campbell considering the uncertainty of
this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory (blessed be Almighty God for
the same) do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and
form following

First, I give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons Joseph Campbell and
William H. Campbell all the tract of land wherow I now live containing,
One hundred and forty seven acres more or less, when they shall have
paid off all my burial or Funeral expences and all other just debts
that remain unsettled at my death unless those expences and debts
should exceed the value of the land, if so it is my will and desire
that the excess should be paid out of the proceeds of the perishable
property or the undivided fund.

Sec^d, It is my will and desire that my lot of land in the County of Early
Known and distinguished in the plan of said County as lot No 67. 28th
district on the Waters of Spring Creek and all my stock, viz. Horses,
Hogs, and Cattle, Household and Kitchen Furniture be equally divided
amongst all my Children, Namely John P. Campbell, James R.
Campbell, Joseph Campbell and William H. Campbell my sons,
and my daughters Caroline Taylor Harriett Allison and Martha
Campbell. Before the above equal distribution is made it is
my will and desire that my Executor shoule give to my two
sons Joseph Campbell and William H. Campbell each a bed
and Furniture, any other children having received like favours
in my life time, and moreover before said equal division
is made it is my will and desire that my daughter Martha
Campbell shoule receive in cash forty dollars, as a just reward
for her attention to me as a nurse in this my last affliction
I hereby appoint my trusty and faithful son Joseph Campbell
Executor of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty second day
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and forty three signed sealed published and declared by the above
named Joseph Campbell to be his last will and Testament in presence

to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting,
Know ye, that on the thirteenth day of November in the Year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three the last will and Testament
of Benjamin Paull late of said County, deceased, was exhibited in open
Court, and in common form of law proved and admitted to record a Copy
of which is hereunto annexed; and administration of the Estate, real and
personal, of said deceased, was granted to John M. Miller and Turner Clark
the executors in and by said will appointed, they having first taken the
oath and performed all other requisites required by law, they are by
Order of said Court, and by virtue of these presents, legally authorized to
administer the estate, real and personal, of the said deceased, according
the tenor and effect of the said will and testament, and according to law
they are hereby required to render a true and perfect inventory
of all the Estate, both real and personal of the said deceased, and have
the same appraised, and returned to this Court according to law, and
to render a true and correct account, to the said Court of their actions
and doings, yearly and every year, until their administration is fully
completed.
