I Joseph Harrison of the County of Taliaferro (and State of Georgia - being) and in body (as usual) and of a sound mind and disposing memory (knowing the mortality of the body) That it is appointed for man to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in form as follows (viz) I send unto my beloved wife Elizabeth the land and plantation whereon I now live with all my stock of Horses, Cattle, sheep, Suckle Hogs and Kitchen furniture, with every other part of my property attached thereto - during her natural life for her to support upon all to be immediately under the care and direction of my beloved son William M. Harrison (and nothing) to be disposed off only by his direction. and that only to be done if it should so be required for her support only, and upon no other Consideration - I have three tracts of land that lies in Appling, Irwin, & Carroll Counties - I send in like manner - but should it be thought best to sell all or either of the above described lots of land. I empower my Executor to sell and make titles to the same, and the money arising therefrom to be put at interest and the interest to be applied to the support of my beloved wife Elizabeth - and the money arising from such sale or sales of the aforementioned lots of land, in Appling, Irwin and Carroll with this manner plantation, and all the parishable estate, as remaining after the death of my beloved wife Elizabeth to be sold on a credit of twelve months by my Executor and the net proceeds to be equally divided between all my Children or their heirs each share an share alike - I send Ind and lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved son William M. Harrison Executor to this my last will and testament - In testimony I have unto it my hand & seal this twenty sixth day of February Eighteen hundred and twenty eight - Enita the words in the instant line to sell money and twentieth line put and twentyfirst line, beloved wife all entered before apogues (signed) Joseph Harrison Seal

Taliaferro County } County aforesaid being in a low State of Health
but of sound mind and memory do make
and ordain this my last will and testament as follows (viz)

Item 1st At my death if my ready money notes and accounts are
not sufficient to pay all my just debts I wish my
Executors to sell one or both of my negroes men, Tom
and Frank, also one hundred and eighty five acres of
Land in Wilkes County whereon I formerly lived. If that
be insufficient to pay all my just debts I wish my Execu-
tors to sell my negro boy Henry, next

Item 2nd All my property both real and personal which shall be
left after my just debts are paid I give to my wife and
Children jointly and Equally - to be kept together for their
use under the management of my wife Rue Thomas
Foster whom I do hereby appoint jointly Guardians
for my Children but in Case my wife should enter Marry
I wish her to have part given off to her, and Thomas
Foster alone to remain Guardian for my Children and
it is my wish that the guardian for my Children to keep
all their property together untill any one of my Children
shall marry or become of age, when I wish an equal
distribution made between them

Item 3rd At any time the guardian for my Children deems it
best to sell any part of the perishable property belonging
to them I wish him to do so

Item 4th It is my desire after the death of my mother that all
the property both real and personal that will fall to
my estate be my wife and Children my wife and
