The last Will and Testament of Subal Watts dec^d was exhibited in open Court on Monday 5th Inst. and duly proved in common form by the Oath of Henry C. Bragg and Daniel Bethune two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, whereupon the same was ordered to be recorded

Personally appeared in open Court David S. Watts who was duly qualified as Executor of the last will and Testament of Subal Watts dec^d whereupon letters Testamentary was ordered to issue to the said qualified Executor - and a warrant of appraisement was ordered to issue to Cordial Daniell, William Sherrill, Daniel Bethune, Micajah Bedell & Arch^d C. Watts - to appraise the Estate of said dec^d -

Know all men by these presents, that I Subal Watts, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, and being very sick and feeble in body, but of sound and disposing memory do make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all other will whatever - Do confirm this and this only to be my last will and Testament - First I recommend my soul to God, who gave it and my Body to the Grave to be entered in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned and as touching my worldly goods, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form - First

My desire is that the property that came by my wife Nancy be given to her a gain namely Negro Girl named Julia, one Gray Horse saddle and bridle One Cow and Calf, one bed and furniture, one trunk and four Chairs - also it is my desire that she should have another bed, and furniture and all the balance of my Household and Kitchen furniture and that she have nothing further of my estate what ever - Secondly

The balance of my Estate of every Description whatever to be sold on such terms and times as my Executors may deem most to the Interest of my Estate and that my Black man Jacob be valued by three disinterested persons and have the sum of his own master provided the

And after the whole of my Estate is turned into money, It is my will that all my just debts be paid, the balance to be divided Betwene my Daughter Sarah, and the Child that my wife Nancy is now pregnant with, and Should either the Child my wife is pregnant with or my Daughter Sarah die, before they are raised it is my will that the Survivor shall heir the whole of my Estate, as left, and Should it so happen, that neither my Daughter Sarah nor the Child that my wife is pregnant with be raised till they are of age or marry, That it is my will and desire, that the property given them be equally divided Betwene my Brother Richard H. Watts and my Sisters, Mary Watts and Martha Watts — Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint David S. Watts and Cordial N. Daniel my sole Executors to this my last will and Testament —
