reduced to writing, in his lifetime but which was by him in his
last sickness declared verbally, in the presence of Alexander
King, Elias Stevens, and John B. Leonard, all of whom he bid
bear witness that the same was his will as ~~before~~ said, at
the house of John S. Daniel in said County, the residence
of said deceased - on the twenty seventh day of October Eighteen
hundred and forty three, to be his last will and testament as
aforesaid

1st He desired all his property, both real and personal
(except one hundred dollars) to be equally divided among
his brothers and sisters

2nd He desired one hundred dollars of his Estate to be
paid to Samuel H. Talmaage for the benefit of the Eggle-
thorpe University at Midway Baldwin County, Georgia

3rd He desired his brother Garrett Gatten to execute all the
purposes of this his last will and testament. Which said
verbal or nuncupative will of the said Gilbert Gatten, so
made as aforesaid, in the presence of us the said King, Stevens,
and Leonard, we have this day reduced to writing,
this the 1st day of November 1843.
